Edward Vermilyea (UNKNOWN) born \_\_\_\_\_ in New York State, married probably in New York State prior to 1844 Mariah, daughter of Martin Chester and Anny (Buer) Zielie, who was born January \_\_, 1827 at Painted Post, New York, died in 1903. Edward and Marriah traveled to Portage, Wisconsin in July of 1845. Her parents are living at Jefferson, Waterloo, Wisconsin in 1850. Edward and family went to Missouri in 1857 (possibly traveling with his brother Charles H. Vermilyea and wife Mary who remained in Missouri), Edward died in 1858 in Missouri. No death record can be found in St. James, Cedar or Phelps Counties in Missouri. Source Code #299 and obit of Joseph D. Vermilyea. After the death of Edward, Mariah married Samuel McGee, Robert McCormick and William Arthurs. **She married Robert McCormick** in Milwaukee City, Wisconsin in 1871, divorced March 14, 1881. She married William Arthurs April 5, 1881 in Dunn County, Wisconsin, divorced March 20, 1888 in Dunn County, Wisconsin. Her tombstone shows her name as Maria Arthurs. She is living with her son Joseph Vermilyea in 1900.

Jane Vermilyea, (Edward) born about 1844 in New York/Illinois, married August 29, 1858 at Albion, Jackson County, Wisconsin Abram Forsyth who was born about 1832 in New York. He died August 18, 1863, place of death is not verified. Abram was a private in the 25<sup>th</sup> WI Vol., Company F. He was enrolled on August 13, 1862 and mustered into service as a private on September 14, 1862. He is reported to have died at Helena, Arkansas August 18, 1863 on one report and Memphis, Tennessee, on another. The cause of Death seemed to be chronic diarrhea or congestive fever contracted at Bluff, Mississippi in July of 1863. His wife, Jane, was only 20 years old when she filed for a pension on August 6, 1864. Maria McGee vouched for her on the pension record, stating that she was present at their marriage ceremony and she is Jane's natural mother. Jane was allotted a pension of \$8.00 per month in 1866, commencing from August 17, 1863, Certificate #77846. Source Code #394.

The witnesses of Jane and Abram Forsyth's marriage were Edwin Vermilyea and Charles Vermilyea. Jane was married on the August 29, 1858 at her father's home at Albion, Jackson County, Wisconsin. The Vermilyea family then left for Missouri.

Source Code #300: Joseph VERMILYEA was born in New York in 1846 and came to Eau Claire in 1865 with his mother and younger brothers and sisters. He was a veteran of the Civil War and married Olive ..... in Black River Falls in 1866. Joseph worked in the woods and on rafts and returned to Eau Claire in 1892, working for the Empire Lumber company and the Daniel Shaw Lumber company. He died in 1933 leaving a son, Harvey, who served in WW 1 and worked for the Press company. He served on the state civilian defense corps during WW II. Tom, a son of Harvey, served in the Canadian army in WW II.

October 27, 1933- obituary: Joseph D. Vermilyea, Civil War veteran and long time resident of Eau Claire and vicinity died at 9:30 o'clock Thursday morning at the home of Arthur Winnery near Elk Mound, after an illness of two weeks. Mr. Vermilyea was 87 years old.

Active G.A.R. Member. The deceased was an active member of Eagle Post GAR for many years having served as post commander two terms and as vice-commander of the department of Wisconsin. Mr. Vermilyea was also appointed aide on the staff of the national commander in 1931. He was active mentally and physically until overtaken with a complication of ailments two weeks ago.

Joseph Vermilyea was born in Steubbing county, New York, January 5, 1845. He was brought to Wisconsin by his parents when a child of 6 months, the family coming by boat from Buffalo to Milwaukee and settling near Portage, Wisconsin. When he was 12 years old the family emigrated by ox team to Missouri, and while there his father, Edward Vermilyea, died leaving his 13 year old son head of the family.

When the Civil War broke out Mr. Vermilyea, then 15 years old, tried to enlist, but his mother arrived at the recruiting office at Madison in time to prevent the move. One year after, in the spring of 1862, he enlisted in the 27th Volunteer Infantry giving his age as 18 although he was but 16 at the time. Joe Vermilyea served 3 years and 3 months during the war, being with the federal army west of the Mississippi the greater share of the time, though his regiment participated in the siege of Vicksburg and was there at the fall of the city on July 3, 1866.

After his discharge from the service with grade of corporal Mr. Vermilyea brought his mother and younger brothers and sisters to Eau caire, arriving here in the fall of 1863, For many years he worked on rafts on the Chippewa, Black and Mississippi Rivers spending the winters in the woods. Later the family settled near Black River Falls and some time after that on the Chippewa River bottoms. He came to Eau claire in 1892 and has been a resident of the city since that time working for the Empire and Daniel Shaw Lumber Companies and later as a carpenter.

Mr. Vermilyea was appointed as a member of the soldiers relief committee of Eau Claire county by Judge George L. Blum 2 years ago and took an active interest in the task. His wife died in 1927. The deceased is survived by one son, Harvey, and one grandson, Thomas, both of Eau claire, and several nieces and nephews.

The funeral will be held Sunday afternoon at 2:30 pm from the Methodist Episcopal church. The Rev. Fred Jordan will officiate and interment will be at Lake View cemetery. Friends may call at

the Stokes Undertaking parlors Saturday until 9 pm.

Charles Vermilyea, (Edward), born February 17/19, 1850 at Black River Falls, Jackson County, Wisconsin, married October 6, 1872 at Menomonie, Dunn County, Wisconsin [Clara Sophia](#) daughter of Lars and Marie (Svends) Christenson/Christianson who was born September 27, 1852/53/54 at Oslo, (Christina) Norway, died September 27, 1929/30. He died August 31, 1914 at Eau Claire, Wisconsin. They are buried in Lakeview Cemetery, Eau Claire, Wisconsin. Source Code #299.

Charles and Clara farmed the Christianson farm until 1876. This farm was 4 miles south of Minomonie. They sold this in 1876 and bought a farm in the Dunville area, called the Lower Chippewa River Bottom. After many crop failures from flooding of the Chippewa River they moved to Eau Claire. He worked for Dell Saw Mill for about \$1.50 per day. Clara had a big garden and cow. There were ten children, two never married.

Source Code #301: 1861 arrived and the Zielie family was involved again in another war. Alexander's cousin's Myron, George and Henry Zielie enlisted with the Wisconsin Volunteers, and Alexander's nephews, Charles, Georg and Joseph Vermilyea also joined the Union Army. These were the sons of Mariah Zielie (Alexander's sister) and Edward Vermilyea. The Vermilyea family had arrived in New Netherland about the same time as the Zielie family, and, in fact, also settled in Harlem before moving to northern New York. The marriage of Mariah and Edward Vermilyea, however, appears to be the first tie of these two old Walloon families.

When the Vermilyea boys enlisted, Aunt Mariah was upset. She hated to see all of her sons march off to war, and especially was opposed to her youngest son, Charles, who was only fifteen years old, volunteering. The captain assured her that he would assign Charles to the duties of drummer boy and caring for the horses. He promised to keep him out of the heat of the battle. Charles and Joseph Vermilyea served together as privates in Company H in the 27<sup>th</sup> Infantry of the Wisconsin Volunteers. Many times in the long marches Joe carried two packs on his back to spare his weary younger brother, Charles.

Wisconsin Troops in Federalized National Guard – Mexican Border Service: (Note: President Wilson mobilized the Wisconsin National Guard on 18 June 1916 as a result of the Mexican Border Crisis. They were assembled at Camp Douglas, WI, to be mustered into Federal Service and then were sent to Camp Wilson (adjacent to Fort Sam Houston near San Antonio TX.) H. C. Vermilyea, Company E, 2nd Battalion, 3rd Regiment of Infantry, Eau Claire, WI, mustered in at Camp Douglas on 30 Jun 1916, departed there on 12 Jul 1916 Arrived at Camp Wilson on 15 Jul 1916 and mustered out on 14 Dec 1916 at Fort Sheridan, Illinois.

Flies Home from France After Four Years in War Zone -- T/4 TOM D. VERMILYEA

Technician Fourth Grade Tom D. Vermilyea, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. C. Vermilyea, who enlisted in the Princess Pat's Canadian Regiment at Winnipeg in April 1940 and who transferred to the United States Army in September 1942, while in England, arrived in Eau Claire on December 23 to spend the Christmas holiday. Sergeant Vermilyea, who is on duty at SHAEF and who is stationed in one of the environs of Paris, accompanied two of his superior officers on a flight from France to the United States, leaving Paris on December 21. He leaves Eau Claire on December 28 and will report at the Pentagon Building in Washington and, from there, accompany the two officers on the return flight, scheduled to arrive in Paris on January 2. It is his first return to Eau Claire during his more than four and a half years of service overseas in the Canadian and American forces.

Sergeant Vermilyea was in London with a Canadian special infantry detachment during the days of the air blitz and the Battle of England and also during the more recent buzz-bomb and rocket bomb attacks. The buzz-bombs were the worst, he said, not only because of the destruction they wrought but because of their menacing sound and the fact they kept soldiers and civilians ducking for air raid shelters day and night. His present duties have taken him over a wide extent of the battleground in France.

'Today is the Day' Writes Eau Claire Soldier Who Saw Paratroopers Off for France

Technician Fourth Grade Tom D. Vermilyea, Eau Claire man who enlisted in the Canadian Army more than four years ago and who transferred to the U.S. Army in September 1942, witnessed the take off of first paratroopers for the invasion of France, according to a letter recently received by relatives here.

Vermilyea, who has been located at the Supreme Headquarters (SHAEF) since early last fall, drove an American major general and a British official to the point of the take-off on the night of June 5, he relates.

The letter, dated June 6, follows:

"Dear Folks, Today is the day. We have started our long-awaited invasion.

Yesterday, the general went on a last-minute checkup of assembly points.

Last evening, we drove to one of the airborne units, one of the many such combat teams, where we witnessed the takeoff of the first parachutists to land in France. "A fine looking bunch in the best of spirits and raring to go. These boys were from every state in the Union and, as far as they were concerned, their job was about done. All their training was for just this moment, and now all they wanted was to get at it. "At several of the planes waiting to take them aboard, the British official and the general wished them the best of luck, and we proceeded to the marshalling point and witnessed the start of the memorable occasion. The ships took off, one behind the other, as regular as clockwork. As the last plane was airborne, the rendezvous took place immediately overhead. The sky had the appearance of a Christmas tree, as all the planes were flying with landing and running lights. "Then, in formation, they made a sweep of the field and started for France. By this time, most of the lights were extinguished. We could hear them going long, after we could see them. As they faded into the night, we all took a deep breath and realized we had seen the beginning of the end for Germany.

"Reached home at an early hour in the morning, too tired to sleep or too nervous is more correct. Such an event is seldom seen, and I guess I'm only human, and I know the general felt the same way."

Discharged - S/SGT. TOM D. VERMILYEA

Staff Sergeant Tom D. Vermilyea, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. C. Vermilyea, arrived in Eau Claire, Wednesday, following his discharge at Fort Sheridan, after five years and two months of service. He enlisted at Winnipeg on April 26, 1940 and went overseas the following July with the Princess Pat's Canadian Infantry, serving in the Aldershot and London areas, during the German air blitz of 1941. He transferred to the United States Army on September 6, 1942 and served in England, France and Germany, until May 25, last, when he started back to this country with 139 points to his credit.
